Seminar in Rostock – Germany, 5th to 9th of November 2012

Dear Madam, Sir, dear colleagues and friends,

the *Institute for Productive Learning (IPLE)* invites you to participate in *IPLE's 24th International Seminar on "Reflective learning – development of competencies: How to work with a portfolio in Productive Learning"* which will be held from 5th to 9th of November 2012 in the city of Rostock at the Baltic Sea.

The seminar is addressed to European teachers, career members and educators working in the field of general education, interested in *Productive Learning* and in supporting self-determined learning processes.

What is *Productive Learning* and why is reflective learning so important for this educational approach?

Productive Learning is learning on the basis of experiences gained in practice placements, chosen by young people themselves according to their interests. Activities in real-life social situations are the starting point for the educational process. Productive Learning teachers/educators work as counsellors supporting the students by initiating an autonomous and independent educational process.

In a self-determined learning process it is important for students to reflect their learning experiences. Traditional school settings do not prepare students for this task. Thus they need support in building up an awareness of how they have learned when they are active and participate in the daily chores at their different practical placements. In this perspective reflective learning is mainly a process and a practice of self-understanding, in which personal meaningful learning objects emerge and can be developed to structure an individual curriculum.

By investigating learning experiences in their own educational practice the participants will go through a process of recognizing important personal learning experiences. They will practice different methods of reflecting and documentation and build up examples of portfolios. Beyond this they will discuss the distinguishing features of this assignment and the new qualities of reflective learning as a part of *Productive Learning* approach.
